Lucie and I have the privilege to share with all of you about the mission and progress of our Non-For-Profit organization "Congo Ubuntu Foundation" in Kalemie township in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. As many of you are aware, we have been in the process of building an Orphanage shelter that will have 54 rooms, 24 toilets, a kitchen, conference room, and offices. Our call is based on ultimate response to the gospel of Christ and biblical principles that are only fulfilled in practicing pure religion "*Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.*" (*James 1:27*), and to do what is good and what the Lord requires of *us to do justice, to love kindness or to love mercy and to walk humbly with our God (Micah 6:8). "Learn to do right! Seek justice, encourage the oppressed. Defend the cause of the fatherless, plead the case of the widow.*" (*Isaiah 1:17*) and Psalm 82:2-4, Give justice to the weak and the fatherless; maintain the right of the *afflicted and the destitute. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked.*"

The purpose is to support the well-being of vulnerable and defenseless orphans in Africa educate, empower, and train future responsible citizens. We are pleased to update you, and the first phase of the building process of the foundation has been completed at the moment the contraction workers and hired engineers have begun to build or raise walls. We are now supporting 100 children last Christmas 2021, and we sent clothes to each child equivalent to \$10 each. Also, we raised funds in the past to help purchase mattresses, blankets, and mosquito nets for the kids; some of these can be found on our website, www.congoubuntufoundation.com.

Please allow Lucie and I to express our deepest gratitude to all of you for the financial and spiritual support you have shown throughout the existence of the Congo Ubuntu Foundation. Our prayers are that you would continue to support us through your prayers as we continue building not only a physical orphanage shelter but also making disciples of Jesus Christ for the glory of God and the transformation of the world together.
